

Victoria's education ecosystem includes a strong network of government-funded TAFE institutes which deliver industry-focused vocational education, and independent education and training providers spanning higher education, research, vocational education and training, English language and professional training programs.





# A Centre for research and innovation

Melbourne is home to Australia's leading research facilities like the Synchrotron and CSIRO. Victoria's universities excel in research, with expertise rated 'above world standards' across 96 disciplines in the Excellence in Research Australia (ERA) rankings.

Our world-class universities, research and development hubs, vocational education and training organisations and English language schools collaborate with overseas providers to deliver tailored education and training programs.

Melbourne is Australia's leading tech city, home to more than half of the country's top 20 technology companies. Victoria's ICT industry has over 8,000 companies, including international firms such as IBM, Microsoft and Intel. Victoria also boasts Australia's largest bioscience research community, with 13 major medical research institutes, 11 teaching hospitals and 9 universities.

Key initiatives, such as the Monash Technology Precinct and RMIT's Advanced Manufacturing Precinct, demonstrate strong collaboration between industry and higher education, providing hands-on learning and research opportunities.

## Work while you study

If you hold a Student (subclass 500) visa, you are permitted to work up to 48 hours per fortnight during the semester and unlimited hours during term breaks and holidays. This ensures that you can focus on your learning while gaining valuable work experience.
